Zion's Mission Statement: Reflecting Christ, we are called to share God's gifts

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Council unanimously voted on April 19 to recommend the congregation purchase the property immediately adjacent to the East of the church, currently owned by member Phil Mohn. Council believes this purchase will enable to us to continue to fulfill our mission to Share God's Gifts. The vote will take place during a special congregational meeting, May 20, 2012 following the 10:30 service.

How will this purchase better equip us to do ministry?

The property's lot and sheds immediately address two critical needs of our growing church: Parking and storage. We continue to hear from people about how crowded our lot becomes on a Sunday morning. (I know people, having seen the lot, have driven home – Pastor Rob). Moreover, even as we continue to clean out stuff, our storage is filled to the brim, creating cluttered spaces and difficulty finding things.

Most excitingly, we envision the house as a ministry center, possibly housing staff for our congregation, such as an intern. It might also serve as a home for a non-profit connected with the church or perhaps a youth after-school program. Pastor Rob is pursuing a number of leads to find a suitable ministry partner for this space. It is exciting to think how this property could further the Holy Spirit's means to share God's gifts through our congregation!

Why purchase it now?

First, Phil Mohn has decided to sell the property. Years ago he purchased the property intending to sell it to our congregation. He came to the church asking if we would purchase the property. Council believes the congregation has the financial means to accomplish this purchase, especially given historical lows in interest rates and the housing market. This property, if not purchased now, may never again be available for the congregation.

How will we finance the purchase?

The property costs \$64,000. Because of particular financial rules, the price is not negotiable; Council's research indicates the price is fair. The church must put \$4,000 toward the purchase price; the balance of \$60,000 will be lent from the Church's "Touching Tomorrow" Endowment Fund at 2%, payable over 15 years. In addition, we expect to incur \$2,000 in closing costs; these will be covered by the Endowment Fund. This translates into a payment of \$368 a month. Depending on the needs of the renter, we may need to spend \$5,000 to \$10,000 to make the house more livable. We plan to borrow these initial refurbishing funds from the Endowment Fund.

As the house is used, we realize there will be utilities and maintenance costs. Because Phil Mohn had rented the house for \$600/month, we believe we can cover our costs through rent.

How will we maintain the property?

The property is in good condition and should not need any significant structural repairs. That said, our current property committee does not have the capacity to serve as a rental property management team. So either the renter pays a sufficient amount for us to hire a maintenance person for the property or they, as a non-profit, agree to maintain the property themselves. A separate team will be appointed to oversee any renovations or work done to set the house up for use.

What are the risks?

With any property, maintenance costs can grow quickly. We believe that actively maintaining the property is essential to limit surprising costs. The main risk is that we do not find a suitable renter and the church is forced to finance the mortgage payment out of operating expenses. In this case, we will include as part of a capital campaign the reduction (or retirement) of the debt.

How does this impact our long-term renovation goals, especially the social hall?

Council believes it prudent to handle this transaction and establish a new rental situation before undertaking anything else. After this has happened, Council will present the congregation with a capital campaign that includes social hall renovations. We believe that within a few years we will have two fully functional ministry centers: the house and the social hall! All this can be accomplished, but we believe the property purchase is more time sensitive.

What if I have questions?

While people may bring up questions at the congregational meeting, if the questions are significant, it is helpful to raise them beforehand. This way Council may have adequate time to prepare an answer. Questions are always welcome, but we have set aside two specific times for conversation and inquiries: 4:30 PM, Wednesday, May 9 and 7:30 PM, Wednesday, May 16.

The last few years continue to show how God is doing something good here at Zion's! Council looks forward to completing the project and seeing how the blessings continue to flow. This purchase, with the additional parking, storage and most importantly, ministry center, will allow God's gifts to be shared for generations to come.

So, come to church on Sunday, May 20 – Music Sunday – and then stay around for an historical vote! In Christ,

10 Summer Activities for Children Provided by Zion's Lutheran

The Christian Education committee has begun discussing how to best handle Summer Sunday School for children. As part of our discernment process, we listed every other activity this church offers for children during the summer!



1) Vacation Bible School: A week of activities, games, Bible stories, songs and meeting new friends. July 23-27; 9-11 AM.

This year's theme is "Amazing Desert Journey."

- 2) Weekly children's sermons: Each week we have a children's message during our morning worship, which begins at 10:30. Kids are invited to come up front for a special message.
- 3) Joyful Spirits Worship: This Wednesday night worship service (6:15-6:45) is one where a kid can be a kid, even if that means making a joyful noise. Originally begun as an outreach to people with developmental disabilities, it has become an incredibly inclusive and child-friendly service. We meet every week throughout the year; in the summer we meet every other week. Starting in June, we will have Ice Cream afterwards!

- 4) Bike and Bible Group: Once a week this group heads out on one of Lebanon County's scenic trails, pauses for Bible trivia and then...stops for Ice Cream! If you child no longer needs training wheels, they are probably ready for the ride!
- 5) Summer special music: Each week various musicians share their gifts with the church. Children will often share a solo or duet during this time.
- 6) Fellowship Time before service:
 Starting at 10 AM, people begin gathering in our Social Hall for a cup of coffee, water and some snacks. In fact, the last Sunday of the month, we put out lots of treats!
- 7) Church Picnic: Last Sunday in July at Levitz Park. Worship and play in the park!
- 8) Summer Camp: Our church encourages kids (and helps pay for them) to go to two local Lutheran Camps, Camp Kirchenwald and Niwakawa.
- 9) By-Heart Challenge: We challenge kids to memorize parts of the Bible and Faith (Lord's Prayer, e.g.). At the end of the summer, we have a party!
- 10) Jersey Shore Trip: Many families, of all ages, travel to the Jersey Shore over Father's Day weekend. Last year over 30 hotel rooms were rented! This creates a safe and fun environment for children to make friends and have fun!

- 2. Numerous repairs completed: Repair of doors and installation of glass window inserts completed. Secretary also instructed to publish safety notice to remind persons using the elevette to be sure to lock doors when finished. Cleaning products are now in Stage Room closet if needed by guests.
- 3. Christian Education committee still deliberating on Summer Sunday School. Pastor is excited to increase parental participation in youth group activities.
- 4. Pastor Rob, Diaconal Minister Emily, Linda Wenrich and Dawn Wolfe traveled to Hanover to attend a Synod sponsored event and presented a table for our "Joyful Spirits" Wednesday evening service. They also gathered ideas for future projects.
