Silence is kept for reflection


P: God, our provider,

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

*Prayer of the Day

P: Gracious God, you have placed within the hearts of all your children a longing for your word and a hunger for your truth. Grant that we may know your son to be the true bread of heaven and share this bread with all the world, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 4:42-44 (pg. 293 in pew Bible)

A man came from Baal-shalishah, bringing food from the first fruits to the man of God: twenty loaves of barley and fresh ears of grain in his sack. Elisha said, 'Give it to the people and let them eat.' But his servant said, 'How can I set this before a hundred people?' So he repeated, 'Give it to the people and let them eat, for thus says the Lord, "They shall eat and have some left." 'He set it before them, they ate, and had some left, according to the word of the Lord.

After the Reading: Congregation: Thanks be to God.

PSALM: Psalm 145:10-18 (pg. 506 in pew Bible, next) (read responsively)

Leader: All your works shall give thanks to you, O Lord, and all your faithful shall bless you. **Congregation: They shall speak of the glory of your kingdom, and tell of your power,** L: to make known to all people your mighty deeds, and the glorious splendour of your kingdom.

C: Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and your dominion endures throughout all generations.

L: The Lord is faithful in all his words, and gracious in all his deeds.

C: The Lord upholds all who are falling, and raises up all who are bowed down.

L: The eyes of all look to you, and you give them their food in due season.

C: You open your hand, satisfying the desire of every living thing.

L: The Lord is just in all his ways, and kind in all his doings.

C: The Lord is near to all who call on him, to all who call on him in truth.

SECOND READING: Ephesians 3:14-21 (pg. 950 in pew Bible)

For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth takes its name. I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Amen.

*Gospel: John 6:1-21 (pg. 867 in pew Bible)

Before reading: P: The Holy Gospel According to St. John, the 6th Chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming towards him, Jesus said to Philip, 'Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?' He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, 'Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, 'There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?' Jesus said, 'Make the people sit down.' Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks,

he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost.' So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, 'This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.'


When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself.


When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, got into a boat, and started across the lake to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. The lake became rough because a strong wind was blowing. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the lake and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. But he said to them, 'It is I; do not be afraid.' Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land towards which they were going.

Please stand as you are able.


P: The Lord be with you. C: And also with you.

*Words of Institution

P: Blessed are you, Lord our God, for creating us to live together in unity and for forgiving our failures in following your call.

Blessed are you, Abba Father, for sending your beloved Son and for adopting us to be your family of sisters and brothers. Lord we receive this good news.

C: Lord, we receive this good news.

P: Blessed are you, Sovereign of mercy, for establishing your kingdom in Jesus the Messiah. He healed the sick and welcomed women and men, and taught the commandments.

Blessed is he, the Son of Man, who became a servant to all, and who overcomes the might of Satan until the end of time. Lord, we believe this good news.

C: Lord, we believe this good news.

P: On the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread, and gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

We remember the good news of his life given for us, his death on the cross, and his rising from the tomb, and together we say:

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: By the power of your Spirit, hidden in the ministry of Jesus, reveal yourself to us here, hidden in this bread and cup. Do not forsake us, but save us in the time of trial. By this mystery of Christ's body and blood, cast out our demons, cleanse our hearts, and strengthen our service toward all in need. Lord, do not ever forsake us.

C: Lord, do not ever forsake us.

P: To you, Lord God, the Blessed One, and to your Son, coming at the end in glory, and to the Holy Spirit, descending on us now like a dove, be all our praise and thanksgiving, now and forever. Amen.

C: Amen.

*LORD'S PRAYER

P: Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

*Invitation to Communion


P: Christ has set the table with more than enough for all. Come!

This is the Lord's table where all are welcome. At the ushers instruction, you are invited to come forward, pick up either a pre-filled grape juice cup, or empty communion cup, and kneel or stand at the communion railing. (gluten free wafers are available for those who need that, please let Pastor know when you are communing) Here, you will first receive the bread, and then either a blessing of your grape juice, or the wine poured into your glass. After consuming both elements, return to your seat by the side aisle, placing your empty glass in the tray.

Those who are worshipping at home this morning are invited to **pray this prayer**, trusting that Christ's spiritual presence is with you at all times and places. If you would like Pastor Caitlin to bring communion to your home, call her at 717 865 3652 and she will be glad to do so.



*Post Communion Prayer




*BENEDICTION

*** GREETERS ARE NEEDED FOR AUGUST! ***



Today we celebrate the 50th anniversary of ordination for Pastor John Merkel. As Bishop Dunlop's letter shares "This is an opportunity to thank God for bestowing upon [Pastor Merkel] the Office of Pastor and equipping [him] to be a faithful steward, preaching the Word, administering the Sacraments, forming many in faith, equipping young people for Christian discipleship, and caring for God's people with love and compassion. It is indeed a holy privilege and blessed trust God has given [him], and indeed to the whole Church of Jesus Christ, for which we rejoice and give thanks to God."

These congregations, in particular, were touched by Pastor Merkel's ministry: St. Paul Lutheran Church in Berlin, NH (1974-1982); Grace Lutheran Church in Baltimore, MD (1982-1988); Hill Lutheran Church in Cleona, PA (1988-1990); St. James Lutheran in Lebanon, PA (1991-2006); and Palm Lutheran in Palmyra (2006-2017). Of course, we would also add Zion's Lutheran in Jonestown to that official list, albeit in a different capacity. We are grateful for Pastor Merkel, and Judy's, presence among us, and for the countless ways they have, and continue to, serve the Church.
