Welcome and Announcements and Prelude

*(Congregation please stand as able)

*<u>CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS</u>

P: We gather in the name of the triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. C: Amen.

P: Today, as we confess our sins, we recognize how easily we overlook the gifts God gives. And we accept the sad truth that our limitations often create the conditions for sin.

Silence is kept for confession.

P: Let us pray.

C: God, we want a faith that feels like more than words, but we lack your power


to embody goodness. We hear your call to serve others yet feel too worn out to make the food. We hunger to taste justice but fear the burning spice of the meal.

We want our place at your table but resist sitting beside a stranger. We have lost our appetites for mere thoughts and prayers, but we fail to match our intentions to our actions. Forgive us and restore us with the healing wholeness of your presence.

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, God knows you are imperfect. But God did not invite you here today because of what you have done or how you have behaved. God loves you and always cares much more for you than your shortcomings. God forgives all your sins in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. C: Amen.

LIGHTING ADVENT CANDLE

L: We light these Advent candles with thanks for what has been, and hope for what is yet to come. As we do, we notice the gifts God has given this week. God, we reach for unreasonable hope;

C: and you prepare an incomparable future.

L: God, we breathe in your peaceful refuge,

C: for you have made a place where we can safely rest.

L: Joy ebbs and flows each day, holy God., C: so we pray to you in honesty.

L: Your love grows unseen, holy God; C: we prepare for you every day.

Choir sings an Advent verse as the candle of Love is lit.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

L: Let us pray. Jesus, you shape the world around us, even when you remain just out of sight. As we listen today, help us prepare our lives for you with loving anticipation. In the name of Christ we pray. Amen.

CHILDREN'S SERMON as the children come forward, please join in singing:

Away in a manger, no crib for his bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head; the stars in the sky looked down where he lay; the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

FIRST READING: Micah 5:2-5a (pg. 756 in pew Bible)

But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labour has brought forth; then the rest of his kindred shall return to the people of Israel. And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; and he shall be the one of peace.

After the reading: Congregation: Thanks be to God

Responsive Reading: Psalm 80:1-7 (pg. 470 in pew Bible, also below)

Leader: Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock!

Congregation: You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh.

L: Stir up your might, and come to save us!

- C: Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved.
- L: O Lord God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers?

C: You have fed them with the bread of tears, and given them tears to drink in full measure.

L: You make us the scorn of our neighbours; our enemies laugh among themselves.

C: Restore us, O God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 10:5-10 (pg. 976 in pew Bible)

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, 'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt-offerings and sin-offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, "See, God, I have come to do your will, O God" in the scroll of the book it is written of me.' When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt-offerings and sin-offerings' these are offered according to the law, then he added, 'See, I have come to do your will.' He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Congregation: Glory to you, O Lord.



P: Before the world knew your face, your own child was born in a quiet stable.


C: Your love blooms in the dark.

***WORDS OF INSTITUTION**

On a night of betrayal, Jesus pulled close friends closer to eat with them one last time. He took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me. Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. Jesus, we remember you died.

P:	We remember God's love sparked life in your dead body.	C: We remember.
P:	We remember you shall return to empty every grave.	C: We remember.

*LORD'S PRAYER

P: Grounded in these promises, we pray the way Jesus taught us :

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

***INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

P: Come, taste the goodness of God's mercy and marvel in what God has done for you.

C: We remember.

C: You set the table with plenty of love.

This is the Lord's table where all are welcome. At the ushers instruction, you are invited to come forward, pick up either a pre-filled grape juice cup, or empty communion cup, and kneel or stand at the communion railing. (gluten free wafers are available for those who need that, please let Pastor know when you are communing) Here, you will first receive the bread, and then either a blessing of your grape juice, or the wine poured into your glass. After consuming both elements, return to your seat by the side aisle, placing your empty glass in the tray.

Those who are worshipping at home this morning are invited to **pray this prayer**, trusting that Christ's spiritual presence is with you at all times and places. If you would like Pastor Caitlin to bring communion to your home, call her at 717 865 3652 and she will be glad to do so.

"Loving Jesus, since I cannot at this moment receive you in bread and wine according to your promise in the sacrament of Holy Communion, I ask you to come to me in Spirit. Feed me, for I am hungry; strengthen me, for I am weak; enliven and sanctify me with Your sacred Body and Blood. Deliver me from all sin and make me always obedient to Your commands. Let me never be separated from You, my Savior, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit live and reign one God forever and ever. Amen."

This year's Christmas tree is adorned with quilted squares crafted by the quilting group, Peace Through Pieces. Each square has a dove on it to symbolize peace—a reminder that Jesus is the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6). A quilt uses many different kinds of material, sometimes even scrap pieces which some might deem as junk, that are then carefully stitched together to create something beautiful. So too, God uses each of us, with all of our faults, and brings us together as members of the Body of Christ, united to bring love and peace to the world.
